Dear brothers & sisters in Christ,

In this season of thanks, I give thanks for the call to serve as your pastor. I've completed two years in this ministry, accompanying you on our *shared journey of discipleship*. Thank you for the ongoing opportunity to serve and to lead in this ministry of Word and Sacrament.

As I wrote two years ago in my very first newsletter message, pastoral leadership is truly a unique calling. I've led in many walks of life – in the military, government, private sector, and non-profits – but pastoral ministry is different. It's a unique blend of leading, serving, and accompanying.

Over the past two years, I have: administered the Sacraments of Communion and Baptism; planned and led a variety of worship services; preached and taught the Word; visited those who are hospitalized or unable to attend worship; prayed for each you and offered counsel when requested; reached out to our local community; and faithfully witnessed to God's love in the world around us.

As I serve, I also lead, using the skills and experiences God has given me in ways that hopefully serve God's purpose in this time and place. My goal is always to accompany, to meet you where you are, to help discern God's call, to assist in equipping others for the journey, and to walk together spiritually. Each day, we go forward in faith, not knowing the exact destination to which God is guiding us.

After two years, it feels appropriate to offer a few thoughts about our journey so far:

- We have worked to create a culture of mutual support, and reconciliation. Progress has been noticeable, but there's still more to do, especially in emphasizing affirmation over criticism.
- We have stabilized our congregation's membership and come to recognize that we are in a different form now than we were before. With decreased size, we've encountered some limitations, but the Holy Spirit remains at work in us and through us.
- And, we are still discerning where God is leading us into the future. Certainly, the paths we
  follow in the years ahead will not be exactly the same as those we traveled in the past, but
  they will be blessed.

As an ordained pastor, my call to ministry originates with God, and is confirmed by the church, so I will do my best to discern where God is guiding us and to seek that path, trusting that the Spirit will fill us and equip us for the journey. I ask for your continuing trust, support, and prayers, for your help in our shared ministry. May we strive to live together in the peace and unity of Christ.



Worship Service of Leave-Taking: With praise and thanksgiving to God, the members of Zion Lutheran Church, 265 North Enola Drive, Enola PA invite you to their "Worship Service of Leave-Taking; Celebration of Ministry In This Place" on Sunday, November 12 at 4:00 pm. Prelude music will begin at 3:45 pm. A time of fellowship will follow the service. Zion Lutheran Church has been a fixture on North Enola Drive in Enola, East Pennsboro Township since the early 1800's. Two church buildings have stood on the site, one adjacent to Brick Church Road (1834, the former Lantz



Schoolhouse) and the present one on North Enola Drive, dedicated in 1927. The adjacent cemetery is approximately four acres, with over 4,500 interred there. The oldest grave dates back to December 1, 1811. Zion's property is being sold to the First Haitian Christian Assembly Church of Harrisburg. They will take possession during the month of November. Zion's congregation will continue to worship in area Lutheran churches; its offices will be housed at St. Paul's Lutheran Church, 6389 Wertzville Road, Enola.

### **SOCIAL MINISTRY**

<u>Trinity's Table</u> continues to show steady growth in numbers, indicating that we are continuing to reach more & more of our neighbors in need each month! In October we saw a 22.45% increase in individuals seeking the aid of Trinity's Table! # STEWARDSHIP A Budget is a Statement of Faith

What does your church's annual budget represent?

Is it a proud menu of the hopes, dreams and missionary ministries your congregation wants to accomplish in the year to come? Or is it a life-support prescription for how the congregation expects to pay the staff, keep the lights burning, the sanctuary heated and the grass mowed? In a workshop when she was stewardship officer for the Episcopal Church, the late Terry Parsons gave this "Devil's Dictionary" definition of a church budget: "It is the means by which we notify the Lord of the limitations we intend to impose on his gifts for he coming year."

If we view the budget — and present it to our congregations — exclusively as an administrative necessity to ensure proper financial management, then we shouldn't be surprised to wind up with bare-bones measures that are grudgingly funded. If funded at all. But if we present the budget to our congregations as opportunities to invest in the Reign of God and stretch ourselves to see how much we can do with even the nickels and dimes God has given us, then the possibilities increase. In the end, a budget is a statement about how a congregation views the future. Do your people trust that ours is the God of abundance who rewards faithful stewards and will stand behind servants who proclaim the Reign of God? Or, not? Put it this way: If an outsider looked at your budget, what would he or she conclude about your congregation's faith? And what would be a "God's Dictionary" definition of a church budget? How about, "It is the means by which we make the most of the abundance the Lord is giving us." Hmmm. That will look nice on the cover of the annual report.



### Lower Susquehanna Synod (LSS)

Social Message on Gun-Related Violence and Trauma The ELCA is currently working on a creating a social message about gun-related violence and trauma. Social messages are ELCA teaching documents that draw from existing social teaching but throw a fuller and sharper spotlight on a particular social issue. The draft's themes focus on trauma, public health, and an ethic of shared responsibility for peacemaking, seeking to move beyond the strict polarization of gun rights vs. gun control.
